1. WHY WE EXIST

1.1 Purpose

The purpose of this handbook is to provide a brief overview of the Surfcoast Longboard Club's Vision, Values, Objectives and Club Administration for our Surfers, Officials, Members, Sponsors and Supporters.

1.2 Overview

We are a club of fun loving longboarders who get together at Point Impossible on Victoria's Surfcoast on the first Saturday of every month between February and November to have some friendly competition and laughs together.

We pride ourselves on our welcoming spirit and family friendly environment. We have some awesome surfers in our midst, including several National and State champs, as well as lots of weekend warriors who do their best to keep the champs honest and have some fun.

We have run two speciality competitions each year too. We ran Wild Women on Water annually in March up until 2023 to encourage more women to surf more regularly. Since then, Surfing Victoria has conducted a Women's Surfing Festival, and we initiated the West Coast Wax Up in its place. We also run the Winter Classic each July, just before the National Titles. It attracts a big field from across the State and is run as a charity events to put something back into our local community. In 2024, we ran it just prior to the WSL event at Bells Beach and managed to attract a large field of international and interstate surfers. Most importantly, we raised \$10,000 to help support a local family in crisis.

Apart from competitions and charity events, we also regularly run coaching clinics and judging courses in conjunction with Surfing Victoria.

The Surfcoast Longboard Club is affiliated with Surfing Victoria.

2. OUR HISTORY

2.1 Our origins

Surfcoast Longboard Club morphed out of the original Westcoast Longboard club in the early 1990's. It's vision is to be recognised as the leading longboard club in Victoria. Its patron is the well-known 1960s surfboard manufacturer George Rice.

Westcoast Longboard Club was formed during the re-emergence of longboarding in the early/mid eighties. Some early, prominent members were Doug Warbrick, Al Reid, Kel and Noel Shanhun, Joe and Jeff Sweeney, Ted and Tim Richmond, Long John and Janaka Peterson, Andy Robertson and Peter Wilson. The club successfully ran the first modern Australian Longboard Titles in the Torquay-Bells area in 1985.

Many members commit yearly to representing the club at longboard events around Australia including the Noosa Festival of Surfing, Malfunction, Australian Open, Crescent Head, Snowy McAllister, Evans Head, Noosa Wrecks and Relics with wins and finals placings in many.

3. COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

3.1 The Winter Classic

Surf Coast Longboarders' Winter Classic has developed as a major local charity event for the club over a 20 year period. Originally the event was organised for club members, their families and friends and other Victorian surfing clubs to get together for a weekend in the middle of winter and enjoy a time of surfing, fun, competition and friendship. Ten years ago, the committee identified a need within the Surf Coast community to 'make a difference' for a group or family.

Since that time, we have raised between \$4,000 and \$12,000 annually for local service groups, local families in financial and/or medical crisis and community minded family assistance organisations.

Other examples include:

- Trevor Barker Foundation Torquay Respite House for families of children terminally ill with cancer 2 years (painted the residence & helped with installation of stair lift)
- Torquay CFA Assisted with purchase of new Fire Truck
- Torquay SES
- Torquay Food Aid
- Torquay Marine Rescue
- Family #1 Family of local surfing identity road accident victim
- Family #2 Local surfing family serious cancer diagnosis
- Family #3 Local family toddler diagnosed with leukaemia
- Family #4 Local family loss of father to cancer
- Family #5 Local family young child diagnosed with cancer
- Great Ocean Road Coast Committee, specifically for revegetation, redevelopment, environment maintenance projects at Point Impossible

The funds are made available to the various recipients without conditions and no acquittal is required.

3.2 Wild Women on Water

The Surfcoast Longboarders' Wild Women on Water (WWOW) event was developed to promote and encourage female participation in surfing. It is run in early March to coincide with International Women's Day.

WWOW is an event that encourages women to spend time in the water and to participate in competitive surfing in a friendly and welcoming way. The event has run using many different formats to get women involved. With the popularity of the day increasing, the organizers have had to develop heats that encourage participation, whilst giving those with competition on their mind an outlet as well. Heats include age group categories, a grom session and an expressions session/tag team surf event.

Whilst the WWOW event is primarily about celebrating and promoting women's surfing it has also raised funds for charities such as Bethany and, more recently, interpretive signage at Point Impossible.

3.3 Fund Raising

All club members are encouraged to source out sponsorship and suggest fund raising activities. Our major annual fund raising activity is the annual Board Draw. The Board Draw involves the sale of 50 tickets at \$50 each with the opportunity to win a custom made Greg Brown longboard. The Draw is run at the Club's annual presentation night with numbered balls draw from a hat. The winner is the last number drawn on the night.

4. SURFCOAST LONGBOARD CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT

Ensure surfers enjoy their surfing

Are encouraged to attain coaching and judging accreditation.

Be safety conscious.

Don't surf alone and watch out for other surfers

Surf by the rules

Control your temper.

Be a team surfer.

Be a good sport.

Treat all surfers fairly.

Cooperate with your club members and surfing mates

Enjoy your involvement.

Aim to improve your surfing.

Avoid ugly remarks about race and gender, religion (This is unlawful conduct).

4.3 Parents, Officials and Members

Encourage participation but do not force it.

Encourage playing by the rules

Never ridicule mistakes.

Remember involvement is for the surfers, not the parents.

Remember surfers learn best by example.

Recognise positively the contribution of voluntary officials.

Never publicly disagree with officials, raise issues privately.

Support the efforts to foster high standards of behaviour for our club and Surfing Victoria.

Support efforts to remove verbal, racial and physical abuse.

4.4 General

The Surfcoast Longboard Club committee will not tolerate:

undesirable behaviour

any forms discrimination, abuse, harassment, ridicule or embarrass anyone covered by this Code of Conduct

anyone not treating all people with respect, dignity and proper regard for their rights and obligations anyone not respecting the privacy of other persons, and any form of victimisation towards others.

Surfers, coaches, judges, parents or officials who do not follow the Code of Conduct may face disciplinary action.

4.5 Discrimination and harassment policy

In addition to the Code of Conduct Surfcoast Longboard Club members are to comply with our Harassment and Bullying policy and procedures. Please refer to our www.surfcoastlongboardclub.com for a copy of this policy.

5. Club Administration

5.1 Volunteers

5.2 Our Committee

The Committee is elected annually at the Annual General Meeting.

Representatives are required to report all relevant issues to the Committee monthly, or as required. It is a policy of the Club that all Committee members have a current Working with Children Check and that the Food Stewards have a current Food Handling Certificate. The cost of obtaining these checks and certificates will be met by the club. A volunteer Working with Children Check is currently free, whilst a Food Handling Certificate costs approximately \$20.

In addition, all club members record their first aid and surf lifesaving qualifications on their membership form so as it may be recorded in our risk management plan and referenced in case of an emergency.

The Annual General Meeting is held at the end of the competition year. At this meeting, the current committee reports on the season's activities and the new committee is elected.

5.6 Presentation Day

The awards for the season are presented on Presentation day. All surfers, families, sponsors friends and supporters are invited to attend. Day time and venue to be announced in advance.

6. MEMBERSHIP

6.1 Categories of membership

Membership consists of the following categories:-

- (a) Full financial member, is a person who has attained the age of 18 years
- (b) Life members
- (c) Junior members
- (d) Family members

All financial and life members have voting entitlements at a General Meeting of the club.

All members have voting rights at the AGM and will also have their names identified on the Club's Membership Register.

6.2 Member Details

The Club will retain a full list of surfers' names, contact details (address, email, mobile) and other information it deems necessary for the operation of the club (e.g. health status, first aid qualifications, Working with Children Checks). Members, Parents / Guardians will be requested to provide this information at the start of each season.

6.3 Annual Subscriptions

Club registration fees are set annually by the Committee. The fees are to be paid by all members except life members and must be paid in full prior to their 2nd competition. No results will be recorded for any non-financial surfers.

The fees for 2025 are as follows:

Single surfer \$65.00Family \$90.00Junior \$45.00

The Club will consider cases of financial hardship. Any family or individual requiring this consideration should forward a 'written request' for consideration to the President, Secretary or the Treasurer.

Competition Day fees are \$5 per surfer for one or two divisions.

6.5 Team Membership

Where the Club has nominated a team in an event, teams will be determined on the basis of ability, availability, surf conditions and gender consideration. The Club requires that teams in these events are committed, reliable and competitive in their event. Team Rep Surfers are to be considered by event coaches and committee members in conjunction with and consultation with other club members available at the time.

6.6 Medical Records, Responsibilities and Insurance

The club will request details of your medical history on the registration form. This information will be kept on file and available on competition day, so that we will be aware of any irregularities or special requirements that you may have.

The club has insurance cover through Surfing Victoria affiliation. This does not replace your own private health cover or ambulance cover. The club also has Public Liability insurance to the value of \$\$\$, as part of this insurance policy.

An injury/incident report form is available on competition days.

For claims to be made, surfers must notify the club's secretary or treasurer.
